In 2017–18, Meals on Wheels was pleased to deliver 65,949 hot meals, 29,723 frozen Apetito meals, 6,449 frozen TimeSaver meals, as well as 5,686 hot meals and 6,600 frozen meals for the Aging in Place and Going Home programs for a total of **114,407** meals delivered to **1,672** clients. This could not have happened without the dedication of our team of **423** volunteers who day in, day out, no matter the weather, deliver the meals, with a smile, into the clients' hands. Our volunteers also contribute valued work in the office and lead our governance at the Board level.

We are grateful for the continuing commitment of our hot food suppliers. Kitchen staff at The Good Companions Seniors' Centre, Garry J. Armstrong Home, Riverpark Place, The Glebe Centre, CHEO, Ottawa Hospital Riverside Campus, Centre d'Acceuil Champlain, and St. Patrick's Home must be recognized and thanked for the work they do in preparing our meals. Thanks also to TimeSaver Foods and Apetito for supplying our frozen food.

None of this would be possible without the funding support of the Champlain Local Health Integration Network and the City of Ottawa. As our main funders, their contributions are invaluable for the continued solid financial health of our service. Thank you also to our group and individual donors who once again stepped up generously.

The staff at Meals on Wheels continue to amaze us with their industriousness, energy, and commitment to our clients. Fifty-two weeks of the year, including many statutory holidays, their hard work keeps everything humming along, come what may.

This year, we are celebrating the 50th anniversary of the founding of our service by the Ottawa City Union of the King's Daughters and Sons. We are thankful for the foresight and hard work of our founders and for the strong and enduring groundwork they laid in place during the first 15 years of our existence, when there was no government funding and no paid staff involved in running the service. Following the path our pioneers carved has made the subsequent 35 years much easier.

With the knowledge that success is only possible with the contributions of the great many people and organizations noted above, we look forward to the challenges 2018–19 will bring as we carry on our mission of supporting our clientele in the most collaborative manner possible.








Client Age Groups






Clients by Gender
